Making Information and Services Accessible to People with Aphasia

Aphasia creates a language barrier that affects comprehension and expression of language. Living with aphasia is similar to trying to communicate in a foreign country where you don't speak the language well. However, with training, specific communication skills and techniques can be taught to reduce the language barrier of aphasia and improve access to both information and services.

In order for people with aphasia to receive community services, key people at an agency need to be trained in specific communication techniques. Because speaking, understanding, reading and writing skills are directly impacted by the brain injury that causes aphasia, access to basic community services is often impossible.

For example, a person with aphasia may not receive proper medical treatment because paramedics are not trained in the specific techniques needed to communicate with someone who has aphasia. Legal services are often not available to people with aphasia because lawyers are not able to cross the language barrier that aphasia creates. Even social services provided by community agencies for the disabled are typically unavailable to people with aphasia. Therefore, people with aphasia are often denied access to basic, life sustaining services.

The Aphasia Center of California (ACC) provides communication technique workshops to both organizations and individuals. After participating in a communication technique workshop, participants become better able to assist the person with aphasia in reducing the language barrier. The ACC has been invited to conduct training sessions with a number of organizations.

A recent series of workshops was held for the California Association of Court Investigators. Court investigators assist the courts in determining if an individual requires a conservator or guardian. ACC staff trained more than 50 court investigators in techniques used to support people with aphasia in expressing their wants and needs. The majority of individuals with aphasia are intelligent, competent people who do not require a court appointed conservator. However, individuals with aphasia run the risk of being judged "incompetent" and having a conservator appointed against their

wishes.

Participants in the ACC workshops learned to augment their spoken input with gestures, pictographs, drawings, and key words in order to improve language comprehension for people with aphasia. Participants also learned techniques to assist individuals with aphasia to express themselves using a variety of methods. A combination of lecture and role-play provided the court investigators with much needed information as well as important practice in using new skills.

After the training, the ACC received notes of appreciation from attendees. One court investigator expressed how helpful the training had been. She indicated they she been able to use her new skills almost immediately with various clients who had aphasia. Providing workshops in communication techniques is one way the ACC is improving the quality of life of all those affected by aphasia.
